It has been a busy week with lots of work going on "behind the scenes." The outside of the Schoolhouse has been scraped, sanded and painted. The Alternative Energy House is getting its first official coat of paint inside. And the Sundial is being upgraded with a beautiful brick border. At the same time, the "front of house" programs are ramping up. On Monday, several families enjoyed their last day of spring break exploring Raven Hill. A small group of scout leaders met on Tuesday to brainstorm new collaborations with Raven Hill and Leadership Charlevoix County (LCC) held its 12th annual Environmental Day at the Center on Thursday.

Even though painting two of the Center's buildings may seem unrelated to the leadership training that LCC provides, both are transformations.
